How Local Historical Societies Can Get Involved

- Create a list of interesting objects or archival materials related to these four themes and have them prepared to share with students or teachers who might reach out to you.
- Connect with your local 250th committee and see if they have any plans to create an event or a prize that you might participate in.
- Encourage students and teachers that you know to consider participating.
- Consider hosting a "Doing History" public day or field trip opportunity to share the historical process with students.
- Engage with local schools or teachers on a Red, White & Blue Schools project.

- We will award certificates of participation to all students and classes that are involved in this initiative.
- We will share with teachers a list of statewide projects that they can participate in and tie to this initiative.
- We will share contact information for local committees and historical societies for any teachers and students who are interested in participating.
